With the problems still etched in our minds that we encountered at Ramsey last spring, we

have decided we are going to run out of the Glen Rock Boro Hall Station on Sunday. Both days we have requested an 8 car train, up 2 from our normal Easter Trains. This means we need to have a few more volunteers each day, but with Tri-State being a partner this year that should not be a problem.

We will be looking for help at the station the weeks before the trips to answer the phones and take orders if customers do not have Internet access. Due to our on-line reservations system we do not need a lot of help at the station but we do need as much help as we can to put out signs and posters. URHS REPORT

The URHS has been busy this past winter with a couple of different projects. Even though there haven't been any work sessions due to the winter season, I would like to update the VRA members on the URHS activity.

Below are the newsworthy items:

New Jersey Transit approved the fence for Boonton Yard.

URHS members discussed the possibility of running a spring train ride on the Cape May Seashore Lines, possibly on National Train day in May.

We have also discussed the possibility of running a fall foliage train this coming October on either the NYS&W Delaware Division or to Port Jervis. More details still have to be worked out.

New Jersey Transit is retiring their Comet I coaches. The URHS has put a request into NJ Transit for one of the Comet I cab cars. As of the January URHS meeting, NJT had not responded to the URHS' request.

The NYGL advised the URHS that the U34CH & Erie 436 will be returned to Boonton Yard this spring.

The Friends Symposium will be held on March 27, 2010 @ Drew University.

The Jersey Central Historical Society will be sponsoring their annual train

show at Mother Seton High School in Clark, NJ on March 7, 2010.

The Erie Lackawanna Historical Society will be sponsoring their spring meet train show on March 21, 2010 at the Parsippany, NJ Holiday Inn.

HAWTHORNE STATION UPDATE

Believe it or not we might actually get the station moved this year. I know we have been working on this project for what seems like decades. But this year looks like we could finally see the building sitting safely away from the corner. It will finally be 75 feet from that high cube truck that would have once again smacked the roof and put the station in jeopardy.

We have met with the President of the NYSW and come to a verbal agreement to get the work started in the spring. We have a copy of a lease in our hands that the railroad gave us and now all we need to do is have it reviewed by our lawyer and the towns lawyer (which is happening as I write this) and make any changes we would like. If the railroad agrees we can sign the lease for not only the station (which is all we have had all these years) but also for the property the station currently sits on and the property on and around where we are proposing the station be moved.

As proof that the railroad is behind what we are doing, they hired a contractor to repair the roof that has been damaged over the many years of being struck. The contractor, who has worked with and for the NYSW for years, did a great job and has even offered to give us a deal on moving the building. We will be meeting with him this week to see what he can offer us.

We have set a target date of April 1st to start the digging for the new basement / foundation and with any luck we will not only meet that date but also we will have all of the work completed before the first day of summer.

As we have said in the past this project is going to take not only a lot of money to complete but also a lot of our volunteer time. Please when the time comes, VOLUNTEER. It is with everyone's help that we will be able to complete this project. Once we are done we will all be able to stand back and proudly look at what we did and as the people walk through the door of the station to look at our JKW Library and railroad museum we can say "We did it".
